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## 1.0 INTRODUCTION

This dictionary provides a standardized set of OSBI SIBRS codes that have been and will be modified to use for reporting.

The format of the dictionary table includes four pieces of reporting information for each data element:

1. The code REF
2. The code
3. A description of the code element
4. A general category for the code groupings

### 1.1 SCOPE

This document will be used to define the SIBRS crime reporting codes. This document will be used as a general definition guide for both OSBI to implement and law enforcement agencies. This is the only document that defines the OSBI SIBRS Codes Dictionary. This document, once approved, shall be the defining data dictionary document and shall not be changed or modified without the express written consent of the OSBI, and notated in this document. All proposed technical changes are subject to the OSBI's approval.

### 1.2 PURPOSE

This document defines the OSBI SIBRS Codes Dictionary to be used for incident based uniform crime reporting. This document shall serve as a common design document to be used by the OSBI and participating local agency contributors to the statewide incident based database.

### 1.3 Note

The following codes are published in the NCIC code document and are not added to this document to save space. Scars marks and Tatoos, and State Codes: December 2000/NCIC 2000 Document.
